Project Introduction

The Project “Construction of Houses for Flood Victims” started from January 1st 2011 to January 10th 2011, with the support of [United Nations Development Program-Pakistan](#). The objective of this project was to “Rehabilitate the Flood Victims of the Village Bhago Teewino”.

Project Area Introduction

The village Bhago Teewino is situated in Union Council Kolachi and Taluka Mehar of district Dadu. The main source of income generation of these people is livelihood and agriculture which was badly affected by the flood. The village was totally destroyed in flood and people of this village became deprived of basic amenities of life like Shelter, Safe Drinking Water, Food, and Medical Needs.

[Participatory Efforts for Healthy Environment \(PEHE-Sindh\)](#) with the support of [United Nations Development Program \(UNDP-Pakistan\)](#) gave a hand to uplift these vulnerable people by rehabilitating them after their displacement. After completion of the project “**Construction of Houses for Flood Victims**”, PEHE-Sindh arranged a Ceremony in order to distribute “**Certificate of Ownership**” among the most deserving super killing disaster survivors of the village according to the degree of vulnerability.

Ms Clark's Press Response



Ms Helen Clark administrator UNDP while responding to press said; United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) has promised to continue supporting the Government of Pakistan in its efforts to rebuild infrastructure and restore the social services and livelihoods destroyed by last year's massive floods.

“With its long-standing and extensive presence in Pakistan and the financial support of a range of partners, UNDP will continue to help communities in the worst-

affected areas to rebuild their lives, prioritizing needs identified by the communities themselves,” said Helen Clark, the UNDP Administrator.

Ms.Helen Clark said that flood consequences led to great miseries to the people enforcing the population to the displacement, they lost their all the belongings consequently.

“UNDP’s early recovery programme has so far mobilized \$90 million of its \$120 million target to support the Pakistani people’s recovery from this unprecedented disaster,” said Ms. Clark.

“While we work together with people and communities to build houses, repair roads and schools, it is also crucial to put in place systems which will reduce the impact of future disasters,” she added.
