Participatory Efforts for Healthy Environment-PEHE, a non-government, not-for-profit socio economic development organization, started its development journey from a small initiative. Since its inception PEHE is striving hard to provide a platform to marginalized communities to have easy access to basic needs and to create a society where everyone has right to equal opportunity. It is led by young, energetic professional whose vision is to bring un-accessed, deprived and marginalized communities in the mainstream of life.

Our voluntary Community Health Awareness Program (CHAP) in Dadu, Hyderabad, Jacobabad and Jamshoro districts makes our organization as one of the key voluntary organizations on primary health and hygiene in Sindh.

While our thematic focus is on Advocacy and Awareness, Social Mobilization and Capacity Building, Shelter and Community Physical Infrastructure, Water and Sanitation, Health and Hygiene, Livelihood and Food Security, Emergency and Disaster response, Recovery and Rehabilitation, Live stock rearing and Development, Poverty Alleviation, Education, Women Empowerments, Child Rights, Social Protection.

PEHE has implemented 19 projects of worth more than PKR 500 millions in Districts Hyderabad, Jamshoro, Dadu, Qamber@shahdadkot, Jacobabad, Sukkur, Shaheed Benazirabad, Matiyari, Badin and Thata.

In these all efforts, PEHE has built its linkage and good working relationship with the government, non-governmental organization, Community based organizations, Village/Muhalla Development committees, Philanthropist and Respectables and communities at large,

Social Development

PEHE believes in Social mobilization is the core component of the social development at grass roots level to support in bringing social change in the society. Hence a common platform that is created and owned by the poor is a pre-requisite through which the poor can make themselves count in the development process. It has made social mobilization as core activity and entry point followed by different development interventions including social and physical service delivery projects, coordinating and networking while emphasizing on gender balance and good governance. The main aim of the social Development is to mainstream rural poor into socio-economic development and reduce their vulnerability. The specific objectives are to:

- Enable democratic and participatory action resulting in institutionalizing social justice, as a basis of social and economic development;
- Make village organizations development oriented, sustainable and responsive to local needs and priorities; and
- Highlight social development issues gender, governance and globalization - and create forum for discussion and broad-based partnerships to evolve and develop around these issues

PEHE has impart social awareness to the communities specially and CBO/VDO members particularly. The first step towards mobilization of communities is to establish CBOs/VDOs/VDCs in specific target area. The formal structure of these community based organization is already in place. These CBOs/VDOs/VDCs are manipulative to play role during and after projects and it is envision that after ending of project CBOs/VDOs/VDCs remain active in streamlining the development process on grassroots level.

Advocacy.

Sindh particularly is suffering from several social issues such as child labor, indebtedness of Haris, violence against women, violations of human rights, non-participation of poor and socially disadvantaged groups in governance, inter-community bloody feuds and rising incidents of suicides. PEHE being a member of civil society has been on forefront in doing advocacy against the social ills and human rights violations.

With increasing unemployment and poverty, population and underdevelopment in rural areas particularly in remote regions, PEHE has become active in advocacy on social issues.

Building capacity of Grass root Organizations

Capacity building of organizations, individuals and development professionals imply bringing skills and competencies within and enabling them to dealing with development pursuit in way to bring real and sustainable change within their attitudes and behaviors so that they should be capable of addressing their local issues effectively.

Trainings for Staff Members

During the year under review the organization provided different opportunities of learning to its staff members for learning and enhancing their skills. In house sessions were organized and the staff was also sent to various places and training institutes to learn different methods and procedures.

Shelter and Community Physical Infrastructure

PEHE with the collaboration Government of Sindh 's program People's housing cell and UNDP GEF SGP constructed low cost energy efficient houses in the coastal built of Badin and Thata where 240 houses were built out of which 120 in Badin and 100 in Thata district. Besides this; during supreme flood of 2010 PEHE with the support of UNHCR and UND Early Recovery programme constructed 1500 houses for flood affected families in district and Dadu.

In addition to above; PEHE restored community physical infrastructure in the flood hit area and support rural communities in addressing their prioritized physical infrastructure needs in district Dadu and Qamber@shahdadkot.

During working there communities themselves implement these schemes with the technical support of PEHE staff. An objective behind community involvement was to make them realize that provided support is of community and they must own it so that operation and maintenance could be properly done. Besides; social mobilization process was continued and five (16) different committees are formed in VDO for effective implementation of the project. These committees are project management and implementation committee, construction committee, audit committee, operation and maintenance committee. Each committee comprises of five members. The program staff imparts trainings to committee members regarding their roles and responsibilities.

Livelihood

PEHE focuses on development of sustainable livelihoods so that rural people can improve their income and, conserve their land and water resources. In the wake of the current situation of water shortage, PEHE during recent supreme flood supported flood affected communities through sector of livelihood. Some of the important services of PEHE are presented hereunder:

- 2300 Families provided with non-conditional cash grant
- 2300 families/households provided with Conditional Cash Grant
- 11,000 beneficiaries were engaged in CFW activities
- Conducted training about capacity building of 100 livestock keepers on livestock feeding, breeding, disease prevention measures; 10,000 animals vaccinated.
- Conducted training for 200 men and women about effective use of on-farm water management;

- Organized training programs for 200 women in kitchen gardening and provided tool kits.
- Conducted trainings for capacity building of 1,141 villagers (500 women and 641 men) about development of entrepreneurs, knowledge about skills on diversified and alternate livelihood options and transferred assets;
- Provided small livestock animals to 225 women;
- provided agricultural inputs (seeds and fertilizer) to 225 farmers including women farmers;
- Assets such as livestock, small grants in cash, donkey carts, etc. transferred to 641 ultra poor
- Imparted trainings on quality seed production, processing and preservation to 200 farmers;

Agriculture and Food Security

To enhance the capacities of farmers PEHE worked with 14000 Farmers. We run training need assessment by hiring external consultant having experience in the field of agriculture. TNA conducted in the Ghokti feder canal where 23 minors selected on the head, middle and tail location of the canal where need from the training was assessed. Keeping the need of the area in the view training manual on “ On farm Water Management, Organizational Management, Financial Management, Monitoring and Evaluation, Communication and Negotiation skills, Advocacy, Lobbying and Leadership skills were developed. Through these manual Farmers organization were capacitated. Some of the important services of PEHE are presented hereunder:

- Baseline data collected from three tehsil Rohri, Pano Aqil and Saleh pat.
- 2000 Farmers trained on OFWM, Organizational Management, and Financial Management, M&E, Communication & Negotiation Skill, Advocacy Lobbying and Leader ship Skills.
- 2000 farmers get aware through awareness sessions on Water Distribution.
- 2000 farmers get aware through awareness sessions on Water Shortage
- 2000 farmers get aware through awareness sessions on Water efficient cropping pattern
- 2000 farmers get aware through awareness sessions on Water Loses at distributory and water course level
- 2000 farmers get aware on efficient cropping pattern
- Established a tehsil level Network among farmers of three Tehsil Rohri, Pano Aqil and Saleh Pat.
- Developed linkages between Irrigation department, Revenue Department, Area Water Board, SIDA and Agriculture department.
- Exposure visit to 23 FOs Chairman to the Rohri canal Area water Board.

Enterprise Development

To reduce poverty of marginalized sections of the society, particularly women by encouraging increasing household incomes through a holistic application of capacity building, micro-financing, small business skills and marketing support.

- 800 women and 641 men have been imparted trainings skill enhancement and alternate livelihood options.
- 243 farmers trained through 16 Trainings on Agriculture and livestock cum poultry Management and diseases prevention, out of which 81 are women
- 725 families were trained on sustainability of home based business and small business.
- 641 Beneficiaries were trained on marketing of products in district Qamber@Shahdadkot.
- 400 women and men were trained on embroidery and candle making in district Dadu.
- 350 women and men were trained in designing and sewing modern tailoring in district qamber@shahdadkot.

Water-Sanitation-Hygiene

One of the major objectives of the projects is to educate the community on personal / community hygiene matters and preventive healthcare measures. Health education is a process through which people learn causes and effects of relationship between variables and health and well being. Access to information on how communicable / contagious and water born diseases are spread and the knowledge about how to prevent this happening leading to gradual modifications of habits and bring about attitudinal change in human behavior towards a better and healthy life. Health education also provides information on better utilization of scarce resources. Some of the important services of PEHE in this sector are listed as follows:

- Community Led Total Sanitation (CLTS) in 23 villages in 02 UCs of District Dadu;
- Provision of water and sanitation facilities in 45 government girls primary schools in Jamshoro and Jacobabad;
- SSHE trainings to 400 teachers in District Jamshoro;
- Formation of 12 water users committees in Jamshoro and Jacobabad District;
- Hygiene awareness to 20254 men, women, and children in Jamshoro and Jacobabad;
- Capacity building of 100 men and women on water usage, protection and operations and maintenance on water sources in Jamshoro and Jacobabad District;
- Provision of bio sand filters in 45 villages in Jamshoro and Jacobabad District;
- 1280 Health and hygiene promotion Sessions with 6200 mothers and 4100 fathers of children less than 5 years of age to reduce diarrheal diseases
- Organized 14 Hygiene fairs (*Melas*) where more than 30000 persons, especially the mothers and fathers of children less than 5 years, attended;

- Constructed 225 latrines in District Dadu;
- Installed 450 Hand pumps in District Dadu and Qamber@Shahdadtota;
- Provided health and Hygiene to 23000 flood affected families of Dadu, Jamshoro, Jacobabad and Qamber@Shahdadtota.
- Global Hand washing Day was celebrated in 20 schools of Jamshoro.

Health and Hygiene Promotion

PEHE has been working in health sector since last four years. People are unaware of good health practice and modern hygiene. The issue is quite serious in remote rural areas where there is no treatment for common illnesses. The quacks worsen the situation with their home cooked advices. Women and children are the most affected. Women hesitate to visit the doctor for antenatal, natal and postnatal checkup and treatment. Many women die during labor due to non-availability of services of a qualified health care provider. Most of the deliveries in the remote areas are conducted by the untrained TBAs at home, who often use unhygienic methods and instruments. Because of this poor health scenario, PEHE is trying to attract donors to cope with the situation and to improve the health status of rural masses.
